IVRIT and KRIAH LEARNING

<u>IVRIT:</u> We learned the names of the primary colors. What can you find in your house that is אָדוֹם (red)? What about כָּחוֹל (blue) or צָהוֹב (yellow)?

<u>K KRIAH</u>: We learned our first two final letters, ם and ן. Ask me what sound they each say! What items can you find at home that end with these letters (hint: מַיִם and טַּלִּחָן)!

<u>1st GRADE KRIAH:</u> We have been learning the chirik sound, which makes our mouths open wide like מִיץ and מִיץ and מִיץ.
How many words can you find in the Siddur that you can read?
