

Sharing Some of Our Learning With You.

HOMEWORK FOR OUR TAMIM LEARNERS: Now that the chagim are over and we have a consistent routine, the children will start to bring home small amounts of homework. Each child has been given a named reading homework bag to bring back to school each day. We ask that children read with an adult 5 minutes a day, 4-5 times a week, and record and sign their child's reading in the reading homework notebook (also in the reading homework bag). 1st grade will bring home a Read Write Inc. book and Hebrew reading words and / or sentences to read to an adult, as well as a school library book for an adult to read to them. Kindergarten children will start with just a school library book to enjoy with an adult.
