FOCUSING ON MIDDOT FOR SEFIRAT HA'OMER

Throughout the period of Sefirat Haomer, as we prepare for Shavuot and the giving of the Torah, we are focusing on a middah each week. So far we have learned about and practiced the middot of Chessed (kindness), and Gevurah (strength), making smart choices or stopping yourself from doing something when not appropriate.

Some examples of Chessed behaviors that the Tamim learners suggested are helping others, sharing their things, giving to others, letting someone else go first, and including others.

Some examples of Gevurah behaviors that the Tamim learners suggested are eating only until we are full and not any more so that we don't get a tummy ache, staying quiet and not talking during listening times, and being careful not to waste things.
